Re: Draft 2020 Tax Levy



Statement

The District funds its operations primarily through property taxes. Annually the Board must approve a property tax levy ordinance and file it with the County no later than the last Tuesday in December. The Tax Levy Ordinance provides funds for the next year's operations. The Property Tax Extension Lamination Law (PTELL) limits the dollar amount of the tax levy increase to an amount no greater than the consumer price index (CPI) or 5%, whichever is less. The 2020 tax year levy PTELL limit is 2.3%.

Discussion

In prior years the District has requested the CPI increase plus an additional 1.5% to capture growth in the equalized assessed valuation (EAV) of the tax base. There is strong incentive to do this every year because of the way PTELL limits tax increases. Whatever a taxing body does not capture in a given year cannot be gained back unless the District passes a referendum to increase the tax rate in later years.

Based on Board direction in light of current economic conditions, staff is not asking for the full CPI increase this year, nor any new growth in EAV. Staff is proposing a 1.5% increase this year, which is 0.8% less than the full CPI and 2.3% less than what the levy request would have been to capture new growth.

Recommendation

Staff requests input from the Board on the Draft 2020 Tax Levy.
